

St Joseph's Catholic Church 177 Currie Street Nambour It has been a long tradition of the Catholic Church to provide a sacred site as a final resting place for those of our community who have died.

In the past this has taken the form of cemeteries in the grounds of parish churches.

It is becoming more common for people to choose cremation and the interment of their ashes instead of burial. A number of Churches in the Archdiocese have already created special Memorial Walls for this purpose.

The Columbarium at St Joseph's Nambour has been built to provide a permanent resting place for parishioners and their families who wish to have their cremated remains interred.

The Memorial Wall provides limited space for plaques only, in memory of loved ones. The Columbarium and Memorial Wall are situated in the sunken garden next to the Lourdes Grotto (Currie St side)

Interment of Ashes

After the Church funeral service and cremation, the Crematorium will contact the family and advise them that the ashes are ready to be interred. The family then contacts the Parish to arrange for the final interment of the ashes in the Columbarium.

Is there a ceremony?

It is entirely up to the family; however a family service is recommended at one of our weekday Masses, to inter the ashes and pray for the repose of the soul of the person who has died.

Upkeep

The Columbarium is maintained in a clean and dignified condition.

Family members will be welcome to visit prayerfully at any time.

Plaques

All plaques are cast bronze, with a dark background with raised gold lettering and border.
