THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR B 18th April, 2021

"Building a community of Jesus' disciples." We welcome you - We are one family

This weeks Readings: Acts 3:13-15, 17-19; 1 Jn 2:1-5; Lk 24:35-48

I once addressed a departing school senior class and suggested to them that it is possible to have a faith and enjoy life too! I heard one of the teachers quietly say "yes!" in appreciation of that point being made. The point was that our faith is not meant to restrict us, to put a 'dampener' on enjoying life and living it to the full. It need not be a choice of either faith or fun! To those students I recommended that they enjoy their life ahead, but to let God into their life too. "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." (Jer. 29:11)

Many people see 'religion' as a set of rules, of "do's and don'ts" designed to restrict us. Many religions have taught people to *feel guilty* if they enjoy themselves. So many people therefore believe God wants them to suppress joy and happiness. Of course we all need to live responsibly, but we can make the most of the life that has been given to us. A cynic once said "you can tell who the Christians are: they're the ones who never smile!" Let us hope that that does not apply to us!

A joyless existence of mere rule-following is not true Christianity and the abundant life God intends for us. Jesus said: "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly" (Jn 10:10). Life is a gift from God. The Christian life was meant to be a joyous affair, not an ordeal to be endured. Granted, life will always have its difficulties; but even when we face difficulties, God desires that we do so with as much optimism and hope as possible.

God created all of the good, wholesome, enjoyable, and fun things we have on this earth as a blessing for us to enjoy. The key is not holding on to these earthly things too tightly. Here's an example, in the following story:

A wealthy businessman was shocked to see a fisherman sitting beside his boat, playing with a small child. So the businessman asked, "Why aren't you out fishing?" The fisherman replied, "Because I've caught enough fish for one day." "Why don't you catch some more?" the businessman further inquired.

"What would I do with them?" asked the fisherman. "You could earn more money," said the businessman. "Then with the extra money, you could buy a bigger boat, go into deeper waters, and catch more fish. Then you would make enough money to buy nylon nets. With the nets, you could catch even more fish and make more money. With that money you could own two boats, maybe three boats. Eventually you could have a whole fleet of boats and be rich like me."

"Then what would I do?" replied the fisherman. "Then you could really enjoy life," answered the businessman. The fisherman looked at the businessman quizzically and asked, "What do you think I'm doing now?"

FIRST EUCHARIST 2021

The dates for preparation for First Eucharist in 2021 are:

- 1. Parent Information Evening: Thursday, 29th April at 7pm.
- 2. Enrolments close on Friday, 30th April at 2.00pm.
- 3. Enrolment Liturgy at all Masses on the Weekend of 1st, 2nd May.
- 4. In the weeks following there will be four sessions in which parents and children along with a leader will explore the Sacrament of Eucharist. These will take place during the weeks beginning: 3rd May, 10th May, 17th May, 24th May.
- 5. Family Day: On Sunday 30th May we are having a family day during which the children will celebrate First Reconciliation according to a simple Second Rite. There will also be a tour of the Church and an opportunity for parents to give some feedback on the process.
- 6. The children will receive their First Eucharist at any of the Masses on the weekend of 5th and 6th June, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ.
- 7. You may make an offering of \$50 per child for the preparation.

Before the Mass the children will be under the supervision of teachers and team leaders. After the Masses on First Communion day, families and friends are invited to share with the community for refreshments in the Gathering Area. Please bring the Sash you were given at your Confirmation.


