There is no question that the world is filled with an appalling amount of evil and suffering. We are impacted by this reality every day on all levels: emotional, intellectual and practical. The covid pandemic is impacting on our society and world in so many ways. As such it is not surprising that people have a difficult time reconciling this harsh reality with the idea of an all good, all powerful loving God.

Yet so many Christians will testify that **God provides inner resources to cope in the midst of difficulty and suffering.** He promises that He causes all things to work together for good to those who love God (*Romans 8:28*).

But so many people have decided to go through this life without God. Yet the desire to find God is written in the heart of every human being. Without God, we are empty. We may try to fill-up that emptiness in all sorts of ways, but we can never really do it successfully.

A major obstacle to faith is selfishness. Self-giving is vital to any relationship, whereas selfishness damages relationships. If we are consumed by selfishness, how can we tend to the needs of others? Look at those people who believe that having to wear masks or be quarantined or vaccinated are violations of their individual rights!

The author of 'Finding Faith in a Godless World', Alexander J. Basile, writes that our society, being what it is, does not endorse a faith-filled life. As a culture, we have become so wrapped-up in ourselves that we have forgotten about God. We have lost sight of why we were created and how we are meant to live. A world without God is a world without direction. Acts of terrorism, school shootings, child abuse, murder, and war are just a few results of a world that excludes God. We must make a counter-culture decision to focus on becoming more like Jesus.

We are following Jesus' example when we act kindly toward others and show loving concern for them. If we fully realize the worth of others, we will look for their strong points. We will treat others with love and kindness. When we do good for others, God's reign is at work.

# PARISH COVID-19 UPDATE & EVENTBRITE BOOKING SYSTEM

The following restrictions are in place here at St. Joseph's Parish during this time:

A. Government Regulation:

All parishioners must sign in through the QLD Check-in App

- B. Archdiocesan policy—Ticketed seating all parishioners must receive a seat number from the marshals. 100% capacity for ticketed when allocating seating when permitted. Ticketed seating means a person is given a ticket with their seat number on it and will remain (as much as possible) in their allocated seat while at the place of worship. This also means we need your name and contact details for Parish records, to record the number of your seat
  - C. PLEASE continue to use the Eventbrite Mass booking system:
    - The Online booking link is URL Link: https://tinyurl.com/yytf6xk9
- D. **Masks** must be worn in indoor or outdoor spaces if you are closer than 1 person per 2 square metres.
- E. Clergy and readers who are socially distanced from others may remove their mask while speaking and then put the mask back on.
- F. **Parishioners** may remove their masks momentarily for reception of Holy Communion.
  - G. The choir and cantors are required to wear a mask at all times.
