Luke 5:1 - 11: Put Out into the Deep

If you could plan an adventure, where would you go? What would you be doing? Our modern adventures are often well planned, sometimes through a travel agent, at least well supplied, and usually do not expose us to any more excitement than we can handle.

Jesus called his first apostles to the adventure of a life time, to "put out into the deep" In doing so, Peter and his fishing partners are exposed to more than they expected. The miracle Peter experiences leads him to understand that he is in the presence of someone more authoritative than he first realised. His experience of Jesus leads him to confess he is a sinful man. Peter is not perfect, like all of us, he is a person made of a mixture of light and darkness. His self-awareness and honesty are characteristics that God can use.

God will use Peter, as he will use Peter's companions. They will be sent on a mission to spread the Good News. This is the same invitation, and challenge, that Jesus gives to us today. We are called to go on the adventure of a lifetime, our life time, to bring the Good News to those around us.

This adventure is not just an external journey. As missionary pilgrims, we are to make the journey into the heart of God, growing in our own relationship with Jesus through prayer and the Sacraments. We cannot bring to others what we have not received ourselves, or more accurately, we cannot bring to others, who we have not received ourselves.

Our lived experience of Jesus present in our everyday activities can be the greatest adventure, not because of what we do, but because of who we are doing those activities with. This adventure will take regular prayer, as it is Jesus who will be doing the planning, not us. Our relationship with Jesus will help us 'put out into the deep'. Where will your adventure take you?

Archbishop Mark has a message for you It was good to read this week that Sister Jessika Trieu has made her first profession

of vows with the Canossian Sisters here in Brisbane. Jessika was a familiar figure at the cathedral before she decided to enter consecrated life, so we follow her journey with great interest. Consecrated life for both men and women is passing through a time of deep change at the moment, not only in Australia but around the world. But that has often happened before in the Church's history. Consecrated life has been a constant in the Church almost from the beginning, as women and men have chosen to live their baptismal vocation in a more radical and focused way. But the forms of consecrated life have varied enormously through time. At the moment some older and more familiar forms of consecrated life are diminishing, and newer forms are beginning to emerge. Jessika is one sign that the call of Jesus is still as powerful as it ever was. My hope is that others from among us will hear the Lord's call and respond as generously and joyfully as Jessika has. Because when consecrated life has been strong, so too has the Church been strong. Very often in fact it has been the communities of consecrated religious who have led the way of renewal in the Church. They have often been the prime evangelisers. So we need them now, in new forms or old. We need their radical witness; we need their service of the Church and the world.

Forgiveness

The greatest miracle is that there's forgiveness for all that's wrong with us. There's forgiveness from all we've failed to live up to because of our inadequacies. There's forgiveness from our wounds, from all that's left us physically, emotionally, and spiritually limping and cold. There's forgiveness from injustice, from the unfairness we suffer ourselves and from the hurt which we inflict knowingly or unknowingly on others. There's forgiveness from our mistakes, our moral failures, our infidelities, our crimes, our sins. There's forgiveness from relationships gone sour, from marriages, families, friendships, and institutions that have been torn apart by misunderstanding, hatred, selfishness, abuse, and violence. Nothing falls outside the scope of the power to forgive, to resurrect, restore, live with loss, grief and make new, fresh, innocent, and joyful again.

Our lives, to a greater or lesser extent, all end up incomplete, broken, unfairly ripped away from us, and causing hurt to others because of our weaknesses, infidelities, sin, and malice; and still, it can all wash clean again. There's new life after all the ways we've gone wrong in this world. And that comes through forgiveness. There's nothing more healing or miraculous, than a moment of reconciliation, a moment of forgiveness. Our hearts that are frozen and dead from disappointment, bitterness, anger, separation, and hatred can beat again.

In witnessing the warmth and love break through families who are not captive of a bitter and angry heart, we are seeing something that's not just another instance of normal life, of ordinary unfolding. we are seeing newness, restoration, redemption, resurrection, forgiveness. Forgiveness is the most astonishing miracle we will ever see or experience this side of eternity. It, alone, makes for the possibility peace in our world.
