Easter Week 5 Year C: John 13: 31 – 35

As Judas steps out from the upper Room to betray Jesus, Jesus does not complain of His fate. He is aware that He must lay down His life for His disciples, and for all those who will come to believe in Him. For Jesus, the cross is His glory.

Love without expression is a frustrated love. Jesus seeks to show His love through pouring out His life for others. Jesus has already been pouring out His life through three years of healing and teaching. Now He will show just how far His love extends for all people, by laying down His life for them.


This is the vocation of disciples of Christ, to pour out their lives for others. Anyone who has seen a loved one suffer, and has not been able to alleviate that suffering, knows how terrible it feels. We would rather be the person suffering than to see that person we love suffer. It is this compassion that Jesus calls us to show to everyone, not just our families and friends. The word "compassion" means, "to suffer with."

Suffering for others is difficult, but Jesus has shown us the way. Suffering does not have value by itself, suffering united to love has value. Suffering united to Christ has infinite value. Pope Benedict XVI once said, "love without suffering is meaningless, suffering without love is intolerable." It is love alone that gives suffering meaning. It is love alone that gives all of life meaning.

If we could pull back the veil that obscures spiritual realities, we would surely be surprised at what we see. All of our sufferings and sacrifices for others would be seen as a great treasure, moments of great value for eternity. Compassion for others is made glorious by Christ.

This is our vocation, to pour out our lives for others, to love all others as Christ has loved us.





Pilgrimage

The notion of going on a pilgrimage and being a pilgrim is a very ancient one that belongs to the spiritual tradition of all great faiths.

Since early times Christians have been known as pilgrims because they journeyed to the sacred places throughout Christendom. These places of pilgrimage beckoned people to touch and become caught up in the atmosphere and spiritual realities that belonged to their origins.

Today we recognise that each of us is on a daily journey of faith but there is a time in life when we feel called to join with others; seeking, listening, reflecting and seeing the hand of God at work in our own lives.

Mary MacKillop Place offers such an opportunity to journey to significant places in Australia made holy by Saint Mary MacKillop. While on pilgrimage we are invited to reflect on Saint Mary MacKillop's life and to recognise her relevance in our own lives. Such reflection can encourage us to emulate her courage, perseverance, joy and deep faith.

Mary MacKillop Place, North Sydney is recognised as a national place of pilgrimage in Australia and is made sacred by Australia's first canonised saint being entombed in the Memorial Chapel.

This pilgrimage has been prepared by the Sisters of Saint Joseph to help you enter more deeply into Mary and Julian's stories and spirituality.
