Luke 16:1 - 13: You cannot be slaves both of God and of money

Throughout our lives, we face a series of opportunities to serve God or to serve the powers that can provide our lives with riches and pleasures. Honest labour, undertaken with the right disposition, is a blessing from God, it is also a necessary duty to be fulfilled by those who are able, whether in the home or in society. Honest labour provides food, shelter and clothing for ourselves and our families. Jesus was a carpenter before His public ministry, giving dignity to everyday work.

Rule 16 Order of Secular Franciscans (OSF) states, "Let them esteem work both as a gift and as a sharing in the creation, redemption and service of the human community." Through legitimate work and prayerful service in our labours, we bring Christ to others; this is one area of evangelisation that the laity has great access to.


The evangelisation of the workplace, and hence a large part of society, is more necessary today than ever. In the 1980s, a catchphrase became prevalent amongst those who worked in the city, particularly in the finance sector, "Greed is good." Such sentiments are diametrically opposed to the Gospel. To love money is to worship a false God. To serve money is to reject God.

St Thomas Moore was reputed to be a saint long before his martyrdom. He served God through praying the Liturgy of the Hours, he regularly fasted, and under his robes of Stately Office, he wore a hair shirt. St Thomas generously gave his money to his local parish church. He served his king and country diligently, not for financial rewards, but as a service ultimately directed to God. By applying the Gospel to concrete situations in his life, he was able to orientate his life toward God, despite living very much in the midst of the world. When the time came, St Thomas witnessed to Christ with his life; He stated before his martyrdom, "I am the king's good servant, but God's first."

The prophet Amos tells us that we are not to misuse others for our personal financial benefit; we are not to resent the times when we serve God rather than our own interests (Amos 8:4 - 7). Jesus challenges us to keep the right balance in all aspects of our lives, particularly money, by serving God first. *Deacon Adrian Eldridge OSF*
