## Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. It is the traditional day on which the Church remembers Jesus's triumphant entrance into Jerusalem amid a group of people worshipping him, laying down palm branches before him, and shouting his praises. This event is so significant that each of the Gospels has an account: Matthew 21:1–9, Mark 11:1–10, Luke 19:28–38, and John 2:12–19. All four versions depict Jesus at his most glorious moment up to this point in his ministry. What a sharp contrast with Good Friday! At Jesus's Crucifixion, no crowds will sing his praises; instead people will hurl insults at him. An even more dynamic contrast is that of Easter morning, when we encounter the Risen Jesus. Jesus's triumph over the grave far exceeds his entry into Jerusalem.

Today it is clear, however, that the praise given to Jesus on the day he rode into Jerusalem, the day we now celebrate as Palm Sunday, does not indicate that he is to be a worldly king but rather that he is to change the world profoundly and forever by bringing redemption to all people. *(Source: Liturgia)* 

## The Easter Triduum

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum. The word Triduum comes from the Latin word meaning "three days." The Easter Triduum consists of three full 24 -hour days which begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday and ends on Easter Sunday. It is the centre and high point of the entire church year. The Triduum technically is not part of Lent (at least liturgically), but Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday are still reckoned as part of the traditional forty day Lenten fast.

The Easter Triduum celebrates the heart of our Christian faith, salvation, and redemption: the crucifixion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Hence, the Triduum commemorates **the Institution of the Eucharist** - the "sacrament of sacraments" (Holy Thursday), **the Passion, Crucifixion, Death of the Lord,** his descent to the dead (Good Friday), and finally his **Glorious Resurrection** on Easter Sunday. Along with the Ascension, these important events make up the *Paschal Mystery*.

Even though the liturgical year begins chronologically at Advent, it reaches its culmination during the Easter Triduum, particularly at Easter, the "solemnity of solemnities," the "Great Feast." So, to celebrate this crucial part of our faith well, we will be celebrating "three" liturgical celebrations as "one" continuous celebration. This one continuous celebration will be mark by special silences. Starting on Holy Thursday evening at **7pm** we will gather to celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper. At the end of this Mass we process out to the Altar of Repose to spend up to an hour with Jesus where we then leave in silence. On Good Friday the Triduum continues with the Lord's Passion at **3pm.** Here, we gather in silence, and we begin by kneeling as the priest lies prostrate in front of the altar (which symbolises Jesus) for several seconds. We then continue with the Passion of Jesus, which concludes with us all leaving in silence yet again. At 7pm on Holy Saturday, we gather again for the third part of our Easter Triduum celebration by gathering in silence at the bonfire in which we will light the Easter candle and then celebrate the most sacred and Holy Night of the Resurrection of Jesus with great energy and joy. The celebration of Christ's resurrection continue at the 8am Mass on Easter Sunday! I wish everyone a spirit-filled Triduum and a joyous Easter celebration. Thanks, Fr Odinaka.


