Try to picture Jesus surrounded by over five thousand people. They were drawn by the magnetism of his words and the warmth of his personality. The first thing he did was to teach them about the kingdom of heaven. Then he healed the sick. By the time he had finished, it was late afternoon and everybody was hungry. The apostles urged him to send them away. But he wouldn’t hear of sending them away. He worked great miracle to feed them. How happy they must have been as they made their way back to their homes.

The miracle of the multiplication of the loaves prefigures the superabundance of the unique bread he gives us in the Eucharist. The gestures and the words used are the exact same ones that are used in describing the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper: ‘He **took** the bread... **blessed** it...**broke** it... and **gave** it to them.’

On the first day of the week, the day of Jesus’ resurrection, the early Christians met ‘to break bread’ – a technical Eucharistic term. From that time on down to our own day, the celebration of the Eucharist has been continued, so that today we encounter it everywhere in the Church with the same fundamental structure. It remains the centre of the Church’s life.

The Lord nourishes us here in the Eucharistic banquet as surely and generously as he fed the people in the desert. He nourishes us so that we in turn may be able to nourish others.

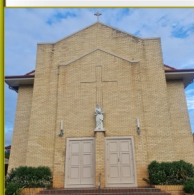
After the miracle at Cana, there was abundant of leftover wine, just as after the feeding of the wandering Israelites in the desert with Manna, and the feeding of the crowds. Jesus the generous giver always provides too much, a sign that his gifts are never meant to be hoarded but to be shared with others.

We are the new People of God. Jesus is in our midst. Here we hear his voice through the scriptural readings. His words are not dead words, they are living words that consoles, inspires, and challenges us in turn. Here at the Eucharistic table, Jesus also heals the wounds of sin and division. He forgives and heals the wound our sins leave behind. He also heals us of our isolationism, our selfishness, our indifference and our hostility towards others. The Eucharist forms us into a community of love. **“Though we are many, we form a single body because we share this one loaf.”** (1 Cor. 10:17)

Here at the Eucharistic table, we are nourished with the food of everlasting life. **‘Unless you eat my Flesh and drink my Blood, you shall not have life in you’** (Jn. 6:53). At the end of each Eucharistic celebration, we are not simply dismissed, rather we’re sent forth as bearers of life to others. Thus, from the celebration to celebration, as they proclaim the Paschal mystery of Jesus ‘until he comes’, the pilgrim People of God advances towards the heavenly banquet, when all the elect will be seated at the table of the kingdom. May the reception of the Most Holy Eucharist enable us to bear abundance of self-giving fruits in our daily life.

Happy Feast of Corpus Christi.

Archbishop Mark has a message for you

Recently we heard that Bishop Ken Howell had been appointed Bishop of Toowoomba after forty years as a priest and bishop in Brisbane. It will certainly be a change of scene for him as he heads out west. Toowoomba itself isn't far from the capital, but the diocese stretches way out to the state border. So Ken will have some very long drives, not to mention many flights in light aircraft. The diocese was cut off from Brisbane in 1929 when south-west Queensland was going through a boom – not just economically but also ecclesiastically as vocations to the priesthood and religious life boomed. In the meantime, the economic and ecclesiastical landscape has changed, and south-west Queensland is facing the many pressures confronting rural Australia as a whole. Farming isn't what it was, and the young often leave for education and employment and never return. So Ken will have his challenges as the diocese adapts to changing facts on the ground. But one thing is certain: the faith that has always been Toowoomba's strength hasn't died. It may not be the potent Irish Catholicism of times past, but it still looks to Jesus in a way that can turn even the driest terrain into a garden.
