Matt 16:21 - 27

We all have a natural aversion to suffering. It is part of human nature to avoid whatever causes us pain. Jesus is different. Jesus does not seek to avoid pain. Jesus does not seek to avoid discomfort. His life as an itinerant preacher in Israel resulted in him missing the comforts of home life, not sleeping in his own bed, not being able to share the company of his Blessed Mother, and experiencing the growing opposition of those who rejected him. Eventually, His life of love led Him to death on a cross.

To be a disciple of Jesus can cause us discomfort. We may be the only voice in the workplace, our family or the Mothers' group bearing witness to Christ and His values. So many people today declare their support for various issues that directly oppose Christ's teachings. We can find ourselves increasingly pressured to conform to worldly values, to water down our commitment to religious observance.

Jesus calls us to renounce ourselves and embrace our crosses. Thomas a Kempis laments in the Imitation of Christ that "Jesus has always many who love His heavenly kingdom, but few who bear His cross. He has many who desire consolation, but few who care for trial. He finds many to share His table, but few to take part in His fasting. All desire to be happy with Him; few wish to suffer anything for Him. Many follow Him to the breaking of bread, but few to the drinking of the chalice of His passion. Many revere His miracles; few approach the shame of the Cross. Many love Him as long as they encounter no hardship; many praise and bless Him as long as they receive some comfort from Him."

We are called to follow Christ with our own personal crosses in this life so we might be ready to meet him when he comes in glory.

This journey is designed to herald the 150th Anniversary of the completion and opening of the Cathedral of St Stephen on the sacred lands of the First Nations Peoples of Meanjin Brisbane. The Message Stick holds an invitation for parishioners across the Archdiocese to come together on Pentecost Sunday, 2024, at the Cathedral to celebrate this momentous occasion.

Our parish is the next recipient of the Message Stick. We'll receive it from Noosa Parish on Monday 4th September. We look forward to presenting it across all our schools and parish communities.

Good Samaritan College Bli Bli will receive the Message Stick on Tuesday 5th, and they have planned to pass it through their various classes. The Message Stick will be received back at the parish during the Wednesday 6th mass before we
