'How often must I forgive...?'

In today's Gospel reading, the characteristic of the community of God's Kingdom are further developed. We are told that it is "the Lord who forgives all out guilt" (Ps. 103:3), "as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our sins" (Ps. 103:12).

This has always been understood as the primary characteristic of the Lord whose love is creative and unconditional. It is otherwise with human beings: they always demand justice, the punishment of crimes and retribution for wrong-doing. Sadly, because of our fallen conditions, there must be a redressing of the balance of right and wrong. We cannot presume that forgiveness will always result in contrition and change of heart; what we can be sure of, however, is that God made us for forgiveness. He wants us to forgive, not just when it is easy for us, but even in difficult times; he wants us to show compassion and mercy. We are called to constantly pray and work for transformation in the Spirit.

The Gospel shows us the truth of our situation: we all yearn to be forgiven, to have our debts wiped away, our dreadful mistakes pardoned. And yet we are so reluctant to forgive even the most casual of offences; we harbor resentment for years, and dishonour the sacrament by approaching the altar with anger in our hearts.

Even in ancient times this pertinent question was at the centre of the search for wisdom: "if a man harbors resentment against another, how can he then demand compassion from the Lord?" If for no other reason, let us remember the transience of life; the terrible finality of death should encourage us to put life in perspective, to show magnanimity and compassion, after the example set for us by Christ our saviour, who forgave even his executioners. Let us also remember that with the insight of wisdom we know that death is the entry into a higher mode of existence, and that whether we live or die, that we belong to the Lord. It is a pledge of our faith indeed that we believe that the life and death of each of us has its influences on the others. The existence of forgiveness therefore is a sure imitation of the divine.
