#### Gospel Reflection: Matthew 22:1 – 14

For several weeks we have been following Matthew's Gospel account of Jesus engaging with the Chief Priests and Elders of Israel. The Chief Priests and the Elders constitute the Sanhedrin, the ancient council that ruled Israel's religious and secular life. In last week's Gospel Jesus used the image of a vineyard to warn the rulers that, *"The kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit"* (Matt 21:33 – 43). Prior to this, Jesus had "Cleansed the Temple", a prophetic act showing the destruction of the Temple was at hand. This week, Jesus uses another Biblical image for God's relationship with Israel, the wedding feast, to warn the same Chief Priests and Elders that they are the ones refusing to celebrate God's relationship with them.


Wedding feasts are times of great excitement. Usually, people are honoured to be invited. At the time of Jesus, the Chief Priests and Elders are responsible for fostering the growth in holiness of the people. The rulers were expected to teach the people, first by example and second, in word. Jesus' indictment of the leaders show that they were more interested in their own affairs than God's concerns. They will not come to the feast.

The expectation to foster the growth in holiness was given to the Church by Jesus. The Vatican Council II taught that the responsibility to grow in holiness, and to spread the Gospel rests with all the people of God. Some members of our St Joseph's community have taken the initiative to provide resources for learning more about our faith in Jesus, and to reach out to others, encouraging them to connect with the life of the parish. This is important work as we have witnessed a decline in church attendance over the last 20 years of so. It is as if people are too busy, too preoccupied to find time for the Kingdom of God. Perhaps some people have been hurt by the Church in the past and are struggling to return.

Some of the things we can do individually is to first pray; pray for ourselves, our families and the wider community. Secondly, explore the learning opportunities advertised on the St Joseph's website and in newsletters. There are on-line resources available through the parish. Thirdly, get involved. Attend some of the social gatherings and meet other parishioners. We can only be strong as a community if we come together as a community.
