Context, Tradition and Wisdom Connections the Gospel of Mt 2:1-12

Context Connection: Matthew, throughout his Gospel, makes it a priority to link Jesus to the Jewish tradition. In chapter one, Matthew emphasizes Jesus's royal ancestry by providing a genealogy that reaches back to King David and even farther to Abraham. The forty-two ancestors of Jesus are listed in three groups of fourteen. The number fourteen is significant. In Hebrew, each letter of the alphabet has a distinct numerical value. The total value of the three consonants in the name David—d, v, d—equals fourteen. Stressing this number over and over again reminds us that Jesus is truly a descendant of David, Israel's greatest king.

In chapter two, Matthew goes on to give us more information about Jesus's being the long-awaited, anointed king. We learn that wise men from the east come looking for the newborn King of the Jews. The magi are a caste of priests from ancient Iran who have detected Jesus's birth by identifying the rising of what they consider to be his star. They search him out to pay him homage. Some scholars have concluded that two texts from the Old Testament influence Matthew's mention of the star and mention of the magi's bearing gifts. In Numbers 24:17 we read: I see him, but not now; I behold him, but not near—a star shall come out of Jacob. This was Balaam's prophesy. Then, in Psalm 72:10, we find this interesting reference: May the kings of Tarshish and of the isles render him tribute, may the kings of Sheba and Seba bring gifts.


These Gentiles from the east recognize the signs of the Messiah's birth and come to honor him. This is a stark contrast to the way Herod, the chief priest, and the scribes react to the pending birth; they lose no time in plotting to destroy the child Jesus. The magi rejoice in the birth of Jesus, presenting him with precious gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh (see 2:11). The wise men are true models of spiritual awareness, for they recognize God's speaking to them in a dream and obey the message they receive.

The magi set out on a journey, not sure of who or what they would find. But their encounter with Jesus the Christ gives their lives, their quest, a profound spiritual dimension. They are never again the same. In fact, they return home by a different route.

Matthew does not give us the exact number of the magi, but according to tradition there are three, which corresponds to the number of gifts presented. Over time, names are attributed to the three.

Tradition Connection: The story of the Epiphany has been embellished over the centuries. In the fifth century, the three kinds of gifts that were given gave birth to the tradition of three wise men. By the eighth century, each wise man had a name: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. In some parts of the Christian world, people exchange gifts on the Epiphany rather than on Christmas Day. In other places, house blessings include writing on the door lintel the first letters of the wise men's names in the middle of the current year. So, for example, the blessing on the feast of the Epiphany in 2006 would look like 20+C+M+B+06. The letters also stand for the expression "Christus mansionem benedicat," which is Latin for "Christ, bless this home."

Context, Tradition and Wisdom Connections (cont. from page 1)...

The salvation that Jesus brought is a mystery that unfolds during his lifetime and continues to grace the Church through the sacraments. The magi come to know through their encounter with Jesus that he is the Christ, the Messiah, a mystery larger than them.

Matthew, through telling the story of the visit of the magi from the east, wants the reader to understand that Jesus came to bring salvation to the whole world. Jesus is the universal sacrament of salvation who, through the Church, continues to bring about redemption (see CCC number 776).

Wisdom Connection: In the first two chapters of Matthew, the author makes the case that Jesus is indeed the Jewish Messiah. He seeks to accomplish this by emphasizing that Jesus is of the royal bloodline of King David. But from this point forward, it is through spiritual signs that people will come to accept Jesus's messiahship. Acceptance, then as well as now, is slow for some. We are all, however, on a journey of conversion. We are invited to be pilgrims on a spiritual journey with Jesus, seeking to encounter him in a real way and be changed forever. If we are fortunate, a lifetime of encounters awaits us. From each meeting, we come away changed, our path pointing us in a new direction. We seek Jesus without the help of stars and dreams, and we find him in people, prayer, and wholesome acts of kindness as well as in distressing situations, silence, and even emptiness. In faith, we have set out on a journey that is uniquely our own, hoping to encounter Jesus the Christ in the fullness of his kingship.


