The Season of Lent!

The season of Lent is one of the five main liturgical seasons in the Church's liturgical calendar which begins with the celebration of Ash Wednesday, and concludes with the beginning of the Triduum (the evening of Holy Thursday). The word comes from the Middle English *lente* and the German *lenz*, meaning "spring".

This season is a time for repentance, spiritual renewal, and conversion to an authentic Christian way of life. It is the most appropriate time for Christian prayer, fasting, almsgiving, other penances and works of charity. Lent is a time, therefore, for all the baptised to make sincere effort to turn away from sinfulness in order to respond positively to the gospel and to experience a change of heart in preparation for the joyous celebration of Easter.

Historically, the season of Lent has been a time of dedication in remembrance of the forty days spent by Jesus in the wilderness fasting and praying, in order to prepare for his ministry and his radical call to humanity to repent and believe in God's reign.

Prior to Lent been officially observed for a full 40 days, Christian communities observed weekly days of fasting and penances, usually on Wednesdays and Fridays of each week. Like springtime itself, each Lenten Season should be a time for spiritual rebirth and renewal for both individuals and the whole communities and cultures.

Pope St. John Paul II once reminded Christians worldwide of the significance of making the most of this traditional penitential season through the long-revered Christian practice of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

As we begin this year's Lenten Season, may it continue to be for us a time of spiritual regeneration and reawakening - a time of grace for us, our families, and for our community. I wish you all a spirit-filled Lenten Season. May God bless you all.

Archbishop Mark has a message for you

In the past Catholics didn't use the word synod too often. But in recent times that's changed. In Australia, we've been on the journey of the Plenary Council which is a special kind of synod. Globally, we're also on a synodal journey with the second of two assemblies to be held in Rome in October this year. And in the Archdiocese of Brisbane we'll have our own synod in September-October this year, with two weekend sessions a month apart, for which we are already preparing. The Brisbane synod will ask how best to implement the decrees and decisions of the Plenary Council locally; and that will help decide the future of the Church in this part of the world. All of these synodal journeys interweave to create a Church which listens more deeply to all the voices, but especially the voice of the Holy Spirit who is the prime mover in all this.
