"Unless the grain of wheat dies..."

How can suffering and death bring life and freedom? Jesus used the illustration of the "grain of wheat" to show how God brings life from death and good fruit through patience and suffering. Seeds by themselves are worthless and lifeless. Only when the seed is **destroyed by burying it in the ground**, can it rise to new life and bear fruit.

What is the analogy which Jesus alludes to in the image of the grain of wheat that must first die in order to rise to new life and **bear good fruit**? Is this simply a veiled reference to his own impending **death on the cross** and to his resurrection? Or does Jesus have another kind of "death and rebirth" in mind for his disciples as well?

Jesus, no doubt, had both meanings in mind. His obedience and death on the cross obtain for us freedom and new life in the Holy Spirit. His **cross** frees us from the **tyranny of sin and death** and shows us the way of **perfect love** and readiness to lay down our lives in **sacrificial service** for the good of others. If we want to receive the abundant new life and the **fruit of the Spirit** which the Lord Jesus freely offers us, then the "outer shell" of our fallen sinful nature must first be broken and be put to death. In **baptism** our "old nature" which was enslaved by sin is **buried with Christ** so we may rise to new life with Christ through the **cleansing waters** of baptism. Paul the Apostle describes this death and rebirth in Christ as a **"new creation"** which Christ accomplishes in us through the power of his saving death and resurrection (2 Corinthians 5:17).

This process of death to the "old fallen self" is both a one-time event which occurs in our baptism, and it is also a daily, on-going cycle of growth in which the Holy Spirit buries us more deeply into Jesus' death to sin so we might rise anew in **the power of God's love**, righteousness (moral goodness), and holiness.

There is a great paradox here. **Death leads to life**. When we "die" to ourselves - to our rebellious sinful nature and wilful rejection of **God's commandments** - we receive **God's forgiveness** and the life-changing power of the Holy Spirit which **frees us to love** and serve others, and **follow God faithfully**. It is God's free gift of grace - his blessing and favour towards us, and the transforming power of the Holy Spirit that enables us to live and serve joyfully as sons and daughters of God.

Archbishop Mark has a message for you

This year St Patrick's Day falls on a Sunday, so it's transferred to the Monday. Around the world Št Patrick's Day stirs raucous



celebration of kitsch Irishism with green beer, leprechaun costumes and rousing renditions of songs like "When Irish Eyes Are Smiling" which was penned in the US not Ireland. All of this is a very long way from the real St Patrick and what the day actually celebrates. St Patrick was the greatest Christian missionary since St Paul, because he took the Gospel beyond the world of the Roman Empire. The Romans never set foot in Ireland, which was regarded as the back of beyond, almost like Mars these days. It was dark and dangerous, completely alien. It was certainly a very violent place. Into all that St Patrick took the light and peace of the Gospel, and in doing so he changed the world, given the global impact of Irish Christianity which has always had a strongly missionary thrust about it. In the Archdiocese of Brisbane we owe a great debt of gratitude to our Irish forebears, not least the four Irish-born bishops; and we acknowledge that as we celebrate St Patrick's Day in this 150th year of the Cathedral.



Dear brothers and sisters,

I write to invite you and your community to join in the Corpus Christi procession which will take place in the Cathedral of St Stephen on Sunday, 2 June 2024, commencing at 2:00pm.

The procession with the Blessed Sacrament will go from the Cathedral, through the city streets, and then conclude with Benediction upon returning to the Cathedral.

Groups are invited to process under banners of their patronal or parish saints, as is often the custom in such processions.

This year on the weekend of the procession, a pictorial display of Eucharistic miracles from around the world will be on display in the Hanly Room in the Francis Rush Centre. You and your parishioners are warmly invited to view this display whilst at the Cathedral. This year there will also be a night vigil of Exposition and Adoration, commencing after the Cathedral's 6:00pm Mass on Saturday evening 1 June, and concluding before the Sunday 8:00am Mass on the day of the procession. This will take place in St Stephen's Chapel.
