### Reflection - John 10:11-18

It has been four weeks or so since we celebrated Palm Sunday and Good Friday. Sombre celebrations of the suffering and death of Jesus. Jesus is not the unwilling victim of an injustice. He is the one who is in control. As Jesus says in today's Gospel, he willingly lays down his life for his followers, "No one takes it [my life] from me; I lay it down of my own free will". The intimacy between Jesus and his followers is such, that he "knows his own" and his own "know me". This is the same intimacy Jesus shares with his Father. This is why Jesus lays down his life for his sheep, he knows us, and he loves us.

Just as Jesus is in control throughout the chaotic time of his own passion, so he is in control of the chaotic times of the passion of the Church. During the passion of Jesus, the wolf, that is the devil (cf. Martin, Francis and Wrigh IV, William M. "The Gospel of John: Catholic Commentary on Sacred Scripture" Grand Rapids MI, Baker Academic, 2015), sows betrayal and despair in the heart of Judas, sows hatred and rejection in the hearts of the Jewish leaders, and sows denial in the hearts of the apostles. Through all this, Jesus was in control. As the Church enters her own passion (cf. Cardinal Robert Sarah, Catholic Herald, https://catholicherald.co.uk/as-a-bishop-it-ismy-duty-to-warn-the-west-an-interview-with-cardinal-sarah/ 5/04/2019) people are expressing concern that the same discord is being sown in the Church and the world; members of the Church are denying Church teaching, rejecting Church Traditions and even natural law. Through all this chaos Jesus remains in control. The sheep of Jesus still listen to his voice. The passion of Jesus came to an end, the victory was Christ's. He had the power to lay down his life and at the command of the Father, he had the power to take his life up again. As the Song of Songs tells us, "Love is strong as death". (cf. Song of Songs 8:6)

It is in our own dying that we will rise to life again in Christ. He has the power to raise us up with him. Jesus is in control. He loves his sheep, he knows his sheep and he will guide his flock through these difficult times. As painful as the passion of the Church is, Christ will raise the Church to a new life, virtue will flourish again, true knowledge of God will thrive, and peace will return to the Church and the world. The good shepherd is in control.
